1. Export a copy of your registry:

- Go to **Start** then **Run**, type "regedit" and click **OK**
- Locate and left click File in the upper left hand corner of the Registry editor
- lick **Export** (Export range All should be selected)
- Choose a location on your hard drive and give the file a name.
- Click Save
- Your registry should now be backed up in a .reg file to the location you specified.
- 2. From this point, please continue without exiting the registry editor.
 - Expand the **HKEY_LOCAL_MACHINE** key (looks like a folder) by double clicking it (or clicking the "+" next to it.)
 - ♦ Expand the **SOFTWARE** Key
 - Expand the Roxio Key
 - Expand the Easy CD Creator Key
 - Highlight the 6.0 Key
 - On the right side, double click on the value called cdkey
 - Delete the values that are already there and re-enter your cdkey all LOWER CASE and WITH the dashes.
 - Click **OK**, close the registry editor by click the **X** in the top right corner and shut down and restart your computer.

Note: It will be easier to use the Registry editor in the future if you collapse the keys that you expanded by double-clicking the expanded key (or clicking the - next to them.)

3. When you are back to your desktop, try loading Audio Central or Creator Classic to see if the software will launch.

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
