



# VideoStudio How to manually reset Corel® VideoStudio to Factory Default Settings

Resetting VideoStudio to default settings requires renaming or removing a specific folder under the User Profile and the Windows Registry. This process resets the program library, so re-importing your videos, images or music files may be necessary afterwards.

Before performing this procedure, please ensure that Corel® VideoStudio is not running.

## **Windows Registry**

**NOTE:** Be sure once entering, to click File> Export> And save a copy of your registry before continuing. Be also sure that the Export Range on the bottom left, is set to All before you press save.

- 1) On your keyboard, hold the Windows Key down and tap the letter R
  - 2) In the run box that appears, type in: regedit and press enter
- NOTE:** To drill down to the necessary locations, simply double-click on each heading to expanding the list

- 3) Navigate to the following locations and rename the keys specified with OLD at the end:

HKEY\_CURRENT\_USER\Software\Corel\VSPPro

HKEY\_CURRENT\_USER\Software\Ulead

HKEY\_CURRENT\_USER\Software\Ulead Systems

## **Windows File Explorer**

1. On the keyboard, launch the **Run** box by pressing the Windows button then the letter R (Windows + R)
2. In the Open box, type %APPDATA% and press the enter key.
3. In the new window, find the Ulead Systems folder.
4. Right-Click the **Ulead Systems** folder.
5. Choose Rename
6. Rename the folder to **Ulead Systems\_Old**
7. Press Enter to commit the change

Once the folder has been renamed, VideoStudio will now reset to its factory default settings when the program is launched.
